#### (1) Cultural Centre

Large and small spaces for meetings, art workshops, exhibitions, conferences. Highly accessible throughout featuring hearing loops, accessible kitchen benches and a Changing Places facility.

#### (2) Gathering Space

Links all the cultural areas and provides opportunities for more significant events and ceremonies. Features use of Kaurna and SA Country Totems and cultural markers to create an immersive sense of arrival on Country.

# (3) Nature Play

An immersive nature play space that uses natural materials to blend culture, learning and fun.

### (4) Event Space

A large, open lawned area for picnics, gatherings, demonstrations, events and activities with close access to car parks, cultural centre and play space.

# (5) Men's Area

Elevated to overlook the entire site with views to the river and hills, provides a space for cultural practice by men including yarning, fire, tool making, spear throwing.

# (6) Women's area

Overlooking the Port River, this is a nurturing, sheltered space for the cultural practices, narratives and traditions of Aboriginal women.

### (7) Cultural Performance Space

A large, circular, adaptable space for dance, performance, events and gatherings featuring terraced amphitheatre seating, lawns and sand.

#### (8) Living Shoreline

Rehabilitation of the river's edge to replace the harsh rock edge with a more natural shoreline that allows tidal flows, mangrove establishment, improved habitat for aquatic and bird life, and cultural integration with the Port River.

# (9) Elders' Area

A peaceful area for conversation and connection that provides gathering opportunities for Elders in the community.

#### (10) Car Park

Accessible car parking off Old Port Road, landscaped to minimise the impact of vehicles with permeable paving to manage stormwater.

### (11) Staff Car Park

A smaller car park for priority visitors including Elders, and providing a convenient bus drop off location for groups.


