We agree that abandoned shopping trolleys are an issue for the majority of South Australian Metropolitan councils. Our Community Safety Officers are regularly reporting abandoned shopping trolleys to retailers for collection; however, they have limited legislative powers to take further action. The Local Nuisance & Litter Control Act is currently under review, and there are proposed legislative amendments to address shopping trolleys. We will continue to work with the community and monitor the proposed legislative changes to address this issue.</p>

The environment initiatives in our draft Annual Business Plan and budget proposes an acceleration of programs highlighted in Council's Living Environment Strategy 2017-2022: See link below: https://www.cityofpae.sa.gov.au/__data/assets/pdf_file/0034/409696/Environment-Strategy.pdf</p> <p>The accelerated program over the next three years will include research and implementation into a new green business incentives scheme and the recruitment of a Sustainability Officer to lead corporate emission reduction activities, support environmental projects and administer the green business incentive scheme, funding to support acceleration of greening of Council's buildings including sustainable materials, energy and water efficiency, solar panels and batteries and solar hot water systems, part funding of a Regional Coordinator for the AdaptWest program, recruitment of a Strategic Planner – Greening and Biodiversity to support a community led approach to urban forests and urban greening, and to lead promotions and community engagement in deliver of Councils urban canopy/tree planting initiatives, accelerated tree plantings to meet new tree planting canopies set by Council, promotion and educational material for community to adopt a tree and promote increased tree canopy initiatives, implementation of living environment and climate action community grants, ongoing support for the Port Adelaide Environment Centre and a review of coastal management plans for the Cities dune system.</p>
<p>I am pleased that you are requesting feedback regarding the Semaphore Foreshore Master-plan. The PAE Council has the opportunity to develop it's foreshore into one of Australia's premier "Family Friendly & Diverse" attractions for both local residents and visitors, from within SA and interstate.</p> <p>However, despite the significant planning improvements undertaken so far, a major inhibitor is the anti social behaviour that continues to plague the foreshore, resulting in physical threat, noise pollution, and safety threat from broken glass etc which is a common feature of the area most weekend mornings. I believe that some of the problems are actually within the PAE Council's ability to control and influence.</p> <p>One major issue is the problems associated with the Palais Hotel, given it's licence to trade until much later than other establishments, thereby attracting a crowd that often results in anti social behaviour. The council should implement monitoring controls to ensure that the impact on the hotel's operations do not adversely impact the broader goal of a "Family Friendly Diverse" locality. Controls could include random inspections, installation of security monitoring equipment and liaison with hotel management to proactively address the problem.</p> <p>If this action is not taken, expenditure of budget will not realise it's full potential, as the Semaphore "Brand" will continue to be somewhat tarnished by the late night anti social behaviour. Last weekend's dangerous assault is another example of many. I am happy to be consulted on with regard this issue, on my behalf, and as part of a team that represents a large and growing local supporter group.</p>	<p>Thank you for your feedback. Protection of wildlife in the Port River we need to ban plastic bags and manage plastics in general at the Torrens Island market as they blow into the river on a windy day	Thank you for the feedback, this issue will be raised with the organisers of the Torrens Island market.
The Rosewater loop (disused railway line)it would be great if this could become a walking/bike trail similar to the Clare Riesling trail -revegetate with native plants(currently this is a dumping ground of broken bottles weeds and other refuse). This could become a tourist attraction linking in with existing bike trails and a native corridor for wildlife. The old railway signs and walk throughs could also go as these are no longer relevant.	Thank you for your feedback. We are continuing to lobby the State Government on this amazing opportunity for the Rosewater loop. The land is under their care and control and accordingly we would require their partnership or approval to conduct a project such as that you have described. We agree this is a great activation and tourism opportunity for our community.
Stop using glyphosate and use and a natural alternative Glyphosate is a known carcinogen	Thank you for your feedback. Council are committed to continuing to investigate and trial methods of controlling weeds without the use of herbicide. In recent years we have implemented thermal weed control (the use of steam) to treat weeds in playgrounds and around schools. This type of treatment is not practical in all situations, however we will continue to explore and where practical implement non chemical alternatives for weed control.
Encourage the development of street verges and volunteer run greening projects (collaborate with Provenance SA native garden – Charles Sturt Council offers free plants once a year to its residents)	Thank you for your feedback. Council's Verge Management Policy encourages people to plant on their verges. We welcome groups like Groundswell to be active in their local area to beautify verges. We're also very fortunate to have a number of groups caring for our dunes and other open spaces.
Look after and re-develop historic buildings in Port Adelaide especially Harts Mill and the surround buildings- the 5 storey brick mill needs restoring.	Council values its Heritage across the whole of the City and in particular Port Adelaide which sits within a State Heritage area. Council has recently embarked on the preparation of a Heritage Strategy which will bring together all of its varied heritage activities into one document, and this Strategy will also identify opportunities to further support our Heritage activities. Hart's Mill is a particularly iconic building which is protected by State Heritage status. Owned by the State Government, parts of the brick mill have undergone restoration over recent years to protect the building from elements and vandalism with repairs to the roof and windows in recent years.

I do not agree with the plan of lighting the shared use path along the foreshore, as it is an additional expense that is not needed, it might be for a safer environment but there is already a safe well lit path, that is known as the footpath, even if lighting is installed there will still be incidences that occur, people do not need to use the path when it is dark, encouraging them to do so with lighting provides no benefit just unnecessary ongoing cost	Thank you for your feedback. The lighting of the path network along the foreshore enables the connection of spaces during evening events and assists people exit the beach area safely once the sun has set.
Spending money for what appears to be just because you have it, an example being replacement of some and additional seating along the foreshore, when there was nothing wrong with the majority of it, I am sure there was justification done, there could be a little more thought as to how expenditure could be reduced slightly so that rates did not continue to go up	Thank you for your feedback. Council has robust planning and review processes in place to assess the condition, suitability and safety of public infrastructure. The vast majority of asset replacements are informed by regular condition assessments and scheduled accordingly. On rare occasions, existing assets may be replaced slightly earlier than scheduled, if there are whole of life cost savings identified, or in the case of a complete strategic renewal of a larger public space. Council carefully considers all aspects of income and expenditure in its annual and long-term financial planning to effectively balance community contributions (through rates) with modern service level expectations in a responsible, transparent and sustainable manner. Importantly, this includes a thorough and ongoing assessment of potential risks and opportunities to deliver services more effectively, including collaboration with other Councils, where it makes sense.

The speed limit is 50km/h along the Esplanade and Council conducts traffic monitoring and listens to community feedback on the installation of traffic control devices such as roundabouts at regular locations to help further control speeds.

However, Rosewater is not due for a concentrated 'greening' until 2023, which is why I'm suggesting that the concept of ratepayer-identified areas should be investigated. I think the City of PAE should develop a community-engagement strategy, one where residents are visited and made aware of the benefits of local greening. I think the strategy should acknowledge that, once new trees are planted in areas such as these, council may have to assume responsibility for watering them for at least a couple of years. In the 2021/22 draft budget it is proposed that \$271,000 be provided for the scope and design of new clubrooms.
Following a number of discussions with Council regarding a possible location for a dog park in Torrens, it is my understanding that TK Shutter Reserve on Fourth Avenue Klemzig may still being considered as well as other locations in Windsor Grove (near linear park).
